Will

I Joseph Fraudlin do make <sup>the</sup> publish this my last  
Will and Testament hereby revoking <sup>the</sup> making both all  
other Wills by me at any other time made. First  
I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be  
paid as soon after my death as possible out of any  
money that I may die possessed of or may first  
come in to the hands of my Executor. I do hereby I give  
I bequeath to my beloved Wife Nichola the sum for which  
I now live <sup>the</sup> see the Doctor so long as she lives. I  
do my best for none of the estates to be sold as long as  
my Wife Nichola lives. I also give I bequeath to my  
Wife Nichola all of the stock on hand at my death except  
the few which I want I also give I bequeath to my Wife  
all of the household & kitchen furniture & all of the clothing  
contents. I also give I bequeath unto my Wife all my  
Rail road stock as long as she lives I do then I bequeath  
to my grand daughter Francis Correll Francis one thousand  
dollars provided she lives to become of age but if she  
dies before that time it must fall to the other  
Wife it is to be her full share of my estate. I also give  
I bequeath to my son Colman Fraudlin one hundred  
acres of land lying on the South side of the hundred  
acres that I sold him at the rates of four time dollars  
for an acre if it amounts to more than his proportionable  
part of my estate he must receive he is to have the one plus  
the my estate. I also give I bequeath to my daughter  
Sheba Spindle one thousand dollars. I do then I bequeath  
to my son Moses B. Fraudlin my half of the Trappe  
tract of land including the west end of said land. I want  
the said land divided by running a line through the center  
of it North South the south land to be valued at four time  
dollars for an acre. I also give I bequeath to my daughter Rhindora  
Estee all of my interest in the east end of the Fraudlin tract  
of land. If I pay for it myself the said Rhindora Estee  
is to have it at the rates of four time dollars for an acre  
with the exception of one tract including the grove yard  
which I reserve for the purpose of a burying ground. I  
also give then wish it not to the stock at any time without  
the consent of the said Rhindora Estee. I also give I bequeath  
to my daughter Elizabeth Nichola one barrel more corn  
than I do when the corn is five years old Elizabeth is to  
have a twenty dollar saddle also when Elizabeth comes  
of age she is to have one thousand dollars. I have one  
hundred forty one acres of land lying South of Colman  
Fraudlin land adjoining the land of George Summerson  
which must be sold when it brings four time dollars for  
an acre & not before. I do hereby appoint my Wife Nichola &  
Fraudlin the executor to carry out this my last Will I Moses

Francine her assistant it is also my wish for my children  
to attend to my three daughters and her for his share as one  
third of the profits of all that is made on the farm also  
one third of all the stock that is raised on the farm in  
testimony of thereof I hereby set my hand and seal this the  
14<sup>th</sup> day of June 1858

to her sole and separate use free from the debts and liabilities  
of her present or any future husband with full power  
to dispose of the same as she may choose with the  
above qualifications and restrictions I do give said property  
of all sort to her and her heirs forever I hereby appoint  
Lewis H. H. of said County & State aforesaid my Executor  
to execute this my last will and testament and any other of  
hereto set my hand and seal this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of August  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
fifty eight
