 and out of the first collections ^{and} Cash on hand to pay all debts
 and demands against my Estate " 2nd I leave my Wife
 Elizabeth Laddleson during her life the tract of land on which
 I reside all of my stores except cloths and as much of my
 household ^{and} kitchen furniture as she may desire
 and at the death of my said Wife said land and ^{and} goods
 and their increase are to be disposed of as herein after shown and
 3rd I give to my nephew Joseph Laddleson Jr. of Franklin County
 and his heirs forever at the death of my said Wife should she
 survive me or at my death should I survive her all of my
 lands and the stores David Wiley & Son 4th I leave here to be
 given to Joseph H. Haddis of Georgia my store Cloths and
 at my death I direct my Executors to deliver said store
 to him or his legal heirs " 5th I direct my Executors to
 sell all my purchasable property as well as that which
 has been received by my wife as well as that which
 has not the first to be sold at my death & the second
 at the death of my said Wife ^{and} I direct that the proceeds
 of the same as well as all the money and choses in action
 of which I may die possessed be divided equally between
 Joseph H. Haddis Son of William Davis & Joseph H. Adams son
 of Anne P. Adams and that my said Executors manage their
 respective ^{and} that they pay the same to the said David Wiley & Adams
 when they arrive at the age of Twenty one years or to their
 respective heirs should either of them die before attaining that
 age 6th I give to Mother Watson nephew of my wife at her
 death say two stores and ^{and} the children of Mary 7th
 I give to Francis Laddleson son of Joseph Laddleson Jr.

my two slaves William and Harison also children of Sally
 8th I give to Isaac Huddleston son of Joseph Huddleston
 my three slaves Jim and Sam & Andrew also sons of Sally
 9th I give to Sydney Pearson wife of Huddred Pearson and one
 of my wife and at my said wife death two hundred dollars in
 cash 10th I also give to Joseph Huddleston son of Luce Pledge
 this thing forever at the death of my wife my negro slave
 named Daction also a child of Sally 11th I have also given
 and conveyed to my friend Peter A. Archer my negro woman
 Sally and her three children Sarah Jane and her infant now at
 the breast a boy named William and I have at my Executors
 at my death to deliver them & their increase to him 12th
 I appoint my friends Luce Pledge and Agnes B. Lawrence
 Executors of this my will and revoke all other wills which
