of such sale to be divided as follows. First I give and
bequeath to my Grand daughter Caroline Clay and

hundred dollars " Secondly I give and bequeath to my Grand
 daughter Lucrecia Ballou one hundred dollars and
 Thirdly I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Mary
 Catharine Ray two hundred dollars and Thirdly I give and
 bequeath the remainder of all my effects to my children to
 be equally divided among them without making any difference
 lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife
 Elizabeth Smith my Executor to this my last Will and Testament
 as long as she lives with the assistance and direction of my
 son David D. Smith and my son in Law D. H. Morris as long
 as and after her death I do appoint whichever a majority
 of my children may select as Executor to this my last
 Will and Testament in witness whereof I do to this my Will
 set my hand and seal this September the 4th 1862

 our names hereto in the presence of the testator this September
