 Grimes be vacated. From which order and proceedings of the
 Court the defendant prayed an appeal to the next Circuit Court

 head of sheep for the support of the family and all the household
 furniture and wearing utensils and if my wife should marry
 I want the said sold and equally divided between her & my
 children and I also give unto my son Drury the coat the
 claims also give my grace to my son James the property
 that is sold after my debts is paid I want the profits to be
 put to the schooling of my children. Ratifying and confirming
 this my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th of July 1833
