 Thus the last Will and Testament of John McBurnett
 John McBurnett is as presented out of
 Court for Probate at the November Term 1875. And the
 handwriting of the said John McBurnett the testator was
 duly proved by the Oaths of Alb. Prator J. F. Burnett and the
 same was ordered to be recorded. Witness my hand at
 office Nov 6th 1875

In the name of God Amen. I Joseph H. Trigg of the County
 of Franklin and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and
 memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and
 transitory life do make therefore and publish and declare
 this to be my last Will and Testament that is to say first
 after all of my Lawful debts are paid and discharged the
 residue of my estate real and personal I give and bequeath and
 dispose of as follows to wit To my much beloved wife
 Eliza Trigg and my son Thomas Trigg I give the tract of
 land lying on the Louisville Road including the Bohm
 tract for two years at the end of two years they shall
 receive it by distribution between all my heirs for the
 use and benefit of said land then the said Eliza and Thomas
 Trigg shall maintain educate and support my children to wit
 Eliza and for the James Nancy Dubois and Fanny Trigg now
 in possession of the above named children shall on my death
 the two years then they shall have their proportion of
 the residue of my estate or remaining two years
 that may come unto the hands of my Executors I also
 give to my wife Eliza and son Thomas Trigg all the stock of every
 description and all the corn fodder and oat - Bacon &c. &c.
 all the household and kitchen furniture all the stock on
 hand at the end of the two years shall be returned
 for a distribution between all my heirs. In addition
 to the above I give to my wife Eliza Trigg one thousand
 dollars out of my money to be paid on my land at my
 death for the purpose of building a dwelling house on said
 Farm. At the end of the two years my wife Eliza Trigg
 shall have choice of her interest in any of my lands
 belonging to said Estate the house next to the graveyard to her
 if she shall make choice of the house tract or so much
 thereof as she shall see her interest in said estate.
 All lands lying on the North side of Lane Hall and
 Pains Creek I give in the hands of my much beloved
 son John Trigg for two years including the steel and

the 12 to 46 corn fodder or our said farm. Now the said John
 Trigg shall pay to my estate one third of the proceeds annually he
 may make on said farm at the end of the two years. Said
 farm and all its contents shall be returned for an equal
 distribution between all of my heirs. All the lands lying on
 the South Side of Beaver Creek in Cheshire & D. M. all fields
 lying on the East side of the Creek in Cheshire about seven to
 acres of choicest lands I put in the hands of my much beloved
 daughter Mary Dyer for two years. She shall build a house
 on the South Side of the River and shall have all she may
 make on said farm one of rents at the end of the two years
 return it in good repair for an equal distribution
 between all of my heirs. A tract of land lying in the
 State of Texas Garbaut County on the Spanish Prairie
 I put in the hands of my much beloved sons William
 and Abner Trigg for two years for which they shall pay
 to my Executors in Garbaut County Texas one fourth
 annually on all improved lands for unimproved land
 they shall have four fifths. Now I John Trigg against
 my Executors in this my last will and testament do give
 John and John Trigg of Garbaut County Texas to pay all my
 just debts and to settle all just debts due my estate.
