 own to her in fee and her heirs. 3rd I do give and bequeath
 to my daughter Louisa and Cynthia jointly my Brown mare and
 saddle to each of them a spinning wheel also to each of them
 one Bed and Bed clothing also to each of them one young sheep
 also to each of them meat enough to do them for the forepart
 year 4th I do give and bequeath to my son George Washington
 Brasfield my shot gun also and cow he to choose out of all
 my stock. A horse one set of plow gear (harrow chaise &c)
 he is to have meat enough to do him this year also he is
 to have one Bed and Bed clothing 5th I do give and bequeath to
 my son S. H. Brasfield and to my daughter Louisa & Cynthia
 Brasfield all the corn that I now have on hand at home and
 at home also. 6th I do give and bequeath to my daughter Betsey wife
 of James Harford my red bay mare and if I do give and
 bequeath to my son S. H. Brasfield Louisa and Cynthia
 Brasfield my best fat dun cow and two pair of shoes
 & over to their joint use & benefit 8th I do give and bequeath to my
 daughters Louisa & Cynthia Brasfield my two young sons.
 9th I do require my property that is not devised above he said and
 after paying my debts I require my Executors to pay over to all
 my children (above and above also) the Balance if any after
 paying all expenses attending in carrying out the provisions
 of this my will 10th My large Bible I do give to James Harford
 by our first child of my daughter Betsey James Harford &c.
 I bequeath to S. H. Brasfield Louisa & Cynthia Brasfield
 my large iron trunk 11th My trunk that my son William gave
 to me I do not want it I do bequeath to my son George

Brasfield my son the sum of Twelve Dollars for the purpose of buying a suit of clothes 14th I do nominate and appoint J.
