Will,

I Martha Lambert of the county of Coffee and state of Tennessee do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former wills heretofore by me at any time made and first I direct that my body may be decently interred in a manner suitable to my situation in life and as to such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to intrust me with I dispose of the same as follows

First I direct that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of any moneys that I may die possessed of or may first come into the hands of my Executor from any portion of my estate real or personal.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my grandson Geo. W Taylor the sum of One hundred dollars to be paid to him when he becomes twenty one years of age.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my grandson James F. M. Taylor the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid to him when he becomes twenty one years of age.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my Grand son William R Taylor the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid to him when he becomes twenty one years of age. I also give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Martha Ann Warren the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid to her when she becomes twenty one years of age or when she marries.

Sixthly I also give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Jane Warren one hundred dollars to be paid to her when she becomes twenty one years of age or marries. And as to the balance of my estate be it be much or little I direct give and bequeath to my two daughters and their heirs Sally Swann and Jane Hileman to be equally divided between them.

I do hereby make ordain and appoint my beloved brother James Taylor executor of my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I Martha Lambert the said Testator to this my will in writing on one sheet of paper set my hand and seal this 21st day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand,
