hath pleased God to bless me with after all my just debts is
paid and funeral expences is paid. I give and bequeath in manner
following to her that is to say: 1st I will and desire that my wife
Elsa Adams have the fifty acres of land I now live on including
the house and farm bed two beds & furniture two cows & calves
her choice five head of hogs all the household and kitchen furniture
One ax and all my farming tools & one cotton wheel & cords and my
several more household stuff & the balance of my estate shall
be left to be sold and equally divided between my children and
at my wife's decease the part so belied to her be sold and equally
divided as above and Lastly I do constitute and appoint my friend
Joseph Smith Executor to this my last Will and Testament hereby
revoking all other or former Wills and Testaments by me her-
etofore made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 16th day of February 1832
