bearing this day of 18th April 1866 do make and declare this my
last Will hereby revoking all former Wills by me at any
other time made. 1st It is my wish that all my just
debts together with funeral expenses shall be paid. 2nd I request my
Executors to take all my effects in to
their hands and settle my estate according to last worth the
exceptions of the law. 3rd I wish them to have five years if
necessary to settle concerning the land. 3rd It is my wish that
the said land now under repairs shall be completed at the
expense of my estate. 4th I give and bequeath to my wife
Mary Simmons the tract of land on which I now reside containing
about seven hundred acres during her life after which to be
equally divided with all of my heirs. Also two thousand
dollars in cash to use as she pleases. 5th I wish my
Executors to manage & control the farm and affairs to the best
advantage collect all monies due the estate and make equal
distribution of the same with all the heirs. 6th It is my
wish that an equal distribution be made between all of my
heirs of my whole estate besides that portion of land given
to my wife which I wish equally divided between them
after her death. Lastly: It is my wish that I hereby consti-
tute and appoint my true sons William & George Simmons
my Executors to this my last Will. In testimony whereof
