 also one brown white 2 year old and one year of other and
 Thayer in good running order and Condition and all the
 ship that I now own 20 head stock of hogs and two
 choice Dutch cows and my buggy and horses and my threshing
 machine and my straw separator and corn sheller and two good
 ploughs and goats two hand plows two bull tongue yokes
 and two turning ploughs and two houghs and log chain and
 one cross cut and hand saw all axes and chisel and
 axe on hand at my death if I shall my wife my shall
 and Mahogany workable."
