In the name of God I Matthew Robinson having unto consideration
the uncertainty of Human life and being of infirm health
but of sound mind and disposing memory do make & thank
almighty God and being desirous to dispose of the worldly
substance which it hath pleased God to bless me with
do make and ordain this my last will and testament
revising all other wills by me heretofore made. Item 1st
I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna
Robinson one third part of the tract of land on which I
now live to be laid off so as to include the buildings
together with one third part of my stock of every description
one third part of my house hold & Kitchen furniture one
third part of my farm entailing one third part of my
Crop of all kinds during her natural life or so long as
she may remain my widow at her death of either marriage
to the efficacy thereof I believe my two nephews
Charles (who is to maintain and educate said Charles)
out of the property above mentioned to them and their heirs
forever. Item 2^d I give and bequeath unto my son
Edward H. Robinson the tract of land on which I purchased
of Stephen Howell also the horse and saddle which I
have heretofore given him to him and his heirs forever
Item 3^d I give and bequeath unto my son in law
Eli Green one half of the tract of land I purchased of
Joseph Tonis during the same time which said Ground now

lives together with all the property hereof given him to him & his heirs forever. Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my son in law the remaining half of the tract of land last mentioned also all the property heretofore given him also twenty Dollars to him and his heirs forever. Item 5th I give Threemonths unto my son James Robinson five Dollars to him and his heirs forever. Item 6th I give and bequeath unto my son Matthew T. Robinson fifty Dollars to him and his heirs forever. Item 7th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Robinson to her and her heirs forever. Item 8th My will and desire is that my negro girl Maria, be sold at my decease and the proceeds evenly divided between my children Sallie Goonetts Anna Cacyphee Rhoda Robinson William Robinson ~~and~~ by Robinson and Elizabeth Robinson to them and their heirs forever. Item 9th I give unto my nephews David Lomison one horse Saddle and Bridle to him and his heirs forever. Item 10th all the residue of my property not yet disposed of I give unto my children Rhoda Robinson William Robinson Percy Robinson and Elizabeth Robinson the remaining two thirds of the tract of land on which I now live to be equally divided between them whenever my daughter Rhoda Robinson shall receive or be come of age the property to be sold at my decease and the proceeds to be apportioned evenly divided between my four that named children to them and their heirs forever. I hereby constitute and appoint James T. Green sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal thereto this 12th day of November in the year of Christ 1831.
