 sum of Ten thousand Dollars agreeably to law & was
 qualified accordingly E. Russell Clk. of Transylvania County but
 Resided in my office this 28th Dec 83/

In the name of God: I Mathew Robinson taking into consideration
 the uncertainty of human life and being of infirm health
 desirous of some will and disposing my money for which I thank
 abundantly God and being desirous to dispose of the worldly
 substance which it hath pleased God to bless me with
 do make and ordain this my last will and testament
 revoking all other wills by me heretofore made. I leave
 I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anne
 Robinson one third part of the tract of land on which I
 now live to be laid off so as to include the buildings
 together with one third part of my stock of every description
 one third part of my house hold and kitchen furniture one
 third part of my farming utensils one third parts of my
 crop of all kinds during their natural life or as long as
 she may remain my widow at her death of either marriage
 to be equally divided between my two youngest
 children (she is to maintain and educate said children
 out of the property above mentioned to them and their heirs
 forever) I then 2nd I give and bequeath unto my son
 David St Robinson the tract of land on which I purchased
 of Stephen Bonaffan also the horse and saddle which I
 have heretofore given him to him and his heirs forever
 I then 3rd I give and bequeath unto my son William
 St Robinson one half of the tract of land I purchased of
 Joseph Davis being the same one which said Son now

him together with all the property heretofore given him to him
 & his heirs forever. Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my son
 in law the remaining half of the tract of land last mentioned
 also all the property heretofore given him also twenty dollars to
 him and his heirs forever. Item 5th I give the same unto
 my son James Robinson five dollars to him and his heirs forever.
 Item 6th I give and bequeath unto my son Matthew of Robinson
 fifty dollars to him and his heirs forever. Item 7th I give
 and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Robinson to her and her heirs
 forever. Item 8th my will and desire is that my negro girl
 Mona, be sold at my decease and the proceeds equally divided
 between my children Sallie Cornett Emma Campbell Rhoda
 Robinson William Robinson Mary Robinson and Elizabeth
 Robinson to them and their heirs forever. Item 9th I give unto
 my nephew David Harrison one horse saddle and bridle to
 him and his heirs forever. Item 10th all the residue of my
 property not just disposed of I give unto my children Rhoda
 Robinson William Robinson Mary Robinson and Elizabeth
 Robinson the remaining two thirds of the tract of land on
 which I now live to be equally divided between them
 whenever my daughter Rhoda Robinson shall marry or she come
 of age the property to be sold at my decease and the proceeds
 to be equally divided between my four last named children
 to them and their heirs forever. I hereby constitute and appoint
 James F Green sole Executor of this my last will and Testament
 In testimony whereof I have set my hand and affixed my
 seal thereto this 12th day of November in the year of Christ
 1831
