

State of Tennessee, At the Court of Pleas and Quarter Session held for Franklin County on the 24th day of August A.D. 1835. Then the last will and Testament of William McRaeles deceased was produced in open Court whereupon came Benjamin Richard & Zachariah Hartman the subs enking witnesses thereto who being justly sworn deposed and say that the said William McRaeles signed the same in their presence in such manner that he the said William McRaeles at the time of signing the same was of sound and disposing mind and memory and that they signed the same as witnesses thereto in his presence and at his request whereupon it is ordered by the Court to be recorded "In testimony whereof I William B. Taggart Clerk of said Court have hereunto subscribed my name on the day and year aforesaid."

In the name of God Amen: I Michael Cawelt of the County of Franklin & State of Tennessee living for advanced in age and though sound in mind yet willing to commit my soul unto the hands of the God of universe and his righteous See and my body to be decently buried in a Christian like manner as fit for the reforms of the world and to prevent all and any disputes that might arise after my decease as to the division of what I may hereafter bequeath do make this my Last Will and Testament provoking any and all debts made by me of a prior date. First it is my will that all just debts and my funeral expenses unpaid by my Executors whom I shall hereafter appoint out of the Goods property otherwise not appropriated in this Will here after named I give unto my beloved and affectionate wife Eva Cawelt all my household & Kitchen furniture also two cows and all the stock of hogs provided she can manage them if not she has the privilege of selling them to be disposed of as I shall here after name also that she has the privilege of living in the house as long as she lives. Secondly all the House property that remains unappropriated in this Will is to be sold at public auction together with all personal and mixed property the proceeds to be equally divided among my daughters whose names I now mention Catherine Hedges (widow of John T. Clegg) Eva Peacock (wife of Jas Peacock) Polly Brumage (wife of John Brumage) Elizabeth Bean (wife of John Bean) Sophia Helle (wife of Reuben Helle) & Mary Lumbard (wife of Solomon Lumbard) also see the household Kitchen furniture with another property of mine given to my wife at her death she is bound to sell it & divide the amount equally divided by my executors among my daughters whose names are mentioned before.  my sons Jacob & John Sively Junior. I do hereby appoint them
 my sole Executors to carry into effect every item as contained
 in this my last will. On the 13th day of July in the year
 of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty four
