

I James M. Dorian Haddon of the State of Tennessee and County of
 Franklin do make and publish this my last Will and Testament
 respecting worldly goods meaning all things by me
 at any time belonging to this estate 1st after my death I will
 that my body be decently buried and that my Executor pay
 my funeral expenses out of any money that I may have upon
 checks at my death or any that may first come into his
 hands 2nd I will that all my lands in Blount County Tennessee
 be sold by my Executor at public or private sale upon
 such time as he may think for the best interest of the heirs
 interested in my estate "

August Term 1870 then the last Will and Testament
 of Samuel Tamm was presented to Court for probate and
 duly proven by the Oaths of J. A. Morton & A. M. Crawford the
 subscribing witnesses thereto and is to be recorded "

State of Tennessee County of Franklin: Know all
 men by these presents I Samuel Tamm of the County of
 Franklin State of Tennessee District No 3rd during sound
 in mind and memory but failing in health do make this my
 last Will and Testament disposing all others, 1st I recommend
 my soul to God who gave it and the disposal of my body to
 my friends 2nd I will that all my just debts be paid
 out of my property or moneys owing to me 3rd I will
 that a certain tract here mentioned be sold by my
 Executor and the money applied to the payment of my debts
 this is worth of a line runs East with Abraham Potts
 down from Leakes Creek to the Tennessee Road and north
 the road to the North boundary of mine to the beginning
 including all the land north of the west of said line and road
 4th I wish for my daughter Mary E. Tamm to have one
 hundred Dollars in good and lawful money at the expiration
 of two years after my death 5th I wish my beloved wife
 Sarah A. Tamm all my land and property of every kind
 to her and my son Samuel Tamm after my death and estate
 after selling the first mentioned tract and all my
 personal property of every kind until my son becomes
 twenty one years of age and then to be equally divided
 between the two 6th after the death of my wife or mar-
 age then to my son 6th I appoint Charles Lane my
 legal Executor to sell the first mentioned tract of land
 either privately or publicly as he may think best and
 apply the proceeds of the payment of my debts and if any left
 to go to my wife and son Samuel Tamm I am signed my
 hand and seal this 25th day of May 1870 Samuel Tamm
 and J. A. Morton from before me Aug 1870 A. M. Crawford
