 Sims
 that her debts be paid "thirdly: distribute her up to as follows
 to wit: I give to Rebecca D. Short wife of Thos Short & Abigail a
 wife of J. G. Sims one hundred dollars each "My sons
 receive their claims to any part of my estate except John who
 is afflicted and is to have a support out of what I leave to
 my two daughters Mary H & Ellen E. Sims. I give and bequeath
 to Mary H & Ellen E. Sims my tavern house & all the furniture
 it contains at my death I also give and bequeath to said Mary H
 & Ellen E. Sims the following negro slaves (to wit) Elvira Rose
 Pansella Ben Buckenood Jimmy Rufus & Alice I also give
 my Pearis & running the chine to Mary H also give to said
 Mary H Sims one hundred dollars. In testimony whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand this 29 day of August 1862
 at New York

 in the tanning business if she wishes she has all
 power as I do to sell or buy
