 and County of Transler calling to mind the mortality of the body being
 frail and uncertain in body but of sound mind and of a disposing
 memory make constitute and ordain this my last will and Testament
 as follows Item the first I give my body to the earth to be buried
 in a decent Christian manner and my worldly goods and chattels
 and Accumulations is my Will that they be disposed of as follows
 viz) the tract of land whereon I now reside containing two
 hundred and thirty acres I Will to my Will beloved Wife
 Elizabeth during her natural life or widowhood afterwards I
 Will it to my beloved son Emory I also Will as my household
 and kitchen furniture together with all my present stock of horses
 & their harness viz) State Jack three Horses one Price and George
 and having to my said Wife Elizabeth during her natural life
 or widowhood as also all my Cows and Cattle and all my
 stock of Horses Cows Sheep &c. It is also my Will that on
 the marriage of any and all of my children who are un-
 married viz) Polly an Sarah and Susannah each and shall
 receive as follows viz) each one a horse bridle and saddle to be
 worth one hundred Dollars one bed and furniture each one
 cow and calf two sheep and hams and pigs each which is to be
 given out of the stock reserved to the widow during her widow
 hood or natural life and at her death or when arriving at all my
 property not otherwise disposed of my Will is that it be equally
 divided between all my lawful heirs my Will also is that my
 Wagon and Farming tools and the Churns be left and disposed
 in this last manner. Item I Will I give to my youngest Daughter
 Susannah one negro boy named Lewis which said Lewis
 is to be valued at the time of the equal division of my estate
 among my heirs and the value thereof to be set out of her the said
 Susannah's dividend and should said boy die before the time of said
 equal division in that case said Susannah is to receive an equal

showing the wish of my heirs my will is that the English
are tract of land purchased of John Anderson and also one hundred
and fifty acres of School land lying on the side of Cumberland and Mountain
were and be disposed of according to that tract of land mentioned in
their joint my desire and that is that my beloved son Greenbury remain
in the premises to take care of and to superintend the affairs of his father
It is also my will that all my down that and also other sports remain
and lie on the premises for the benefit of my family the present generations
then the third I constitute and appoint my well beloved son Samuel
and Greenbury Howard my lawful and legal executor to this my last
will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills be coming this to
be my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 26th day of December in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and thirty four and in the fifty ninth year
of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America
