 interested in my estate "

August Term 1870 then the last will & testament
 of Samuel Tammings was presented to Court for probate ^{and}
 duly proven by the Oaths of J. A. Martin & A. M. Crawford the
 Subscribing Witnesses thereto ^{and} for record to be recorded "

State of Tennessee County of Trousdale. Know all
 men by these presents I Samuel Tammings of the County of
 Trousdale State of Tennessee District No 3rd being sound
 in mind ^{and} memory but frail in health do hereby this my
 last will & testament revoking all others, 1st I recommend
 my soul to God who gave it ^{and} the disposal of my body to
 my friends 2nd I will that all my just debts be paid
 out of my property or moneys owing to me 3rd I will
 that a certain tract here mentioned be sold by my
 Executor ^{and} the money applied to the payment of my debts
 this is worth of a fine cross road with broken Porro
 down from Leakes Creek to the Church to Road ^{and} worth
 the road to the North boundary ^{and} runs to the beginning
 including all the land north ^{and} west of said line ^{and} road
 4th I will for my Daughter Mary E. Tammings to have one
 hundred Dollars in good ^{and} lawful money at the expiration
 of two years after my death 5th I will my beloved wife
 for all ^{and} Tammings all my land ^{and} property of every kind
 to her ^{and} my son Samuel Tammings after my death estate
 after selling the first mentioned tract ^{and} all my
 personal property of every kind until my son becomes
 twenty one years of age ^{and} then to be equally divided
 between the two ^{and} after the death of my wife or mar-
 riage then to my son 6th I appoint Charles Rose my
 legal Executor to sell the first mentioned tract of land
 either privately or publicly as he may think ^{and} that ^{and}
 apply the proceeds of the payment of my debts ^{and} if any left
 to go to my wife ^{and} son Samuel Tammings ^{and} after my
 death and at this 25th day of May 1870 Samuel Tammings

August Term 1890, Then the last will and testament of Benjamin Fanning was presented to the Court for probate and duly proved by the oaths of E. J. Calver & John F. Fanning & the Rules requiring witnesses there to be or send by the Court to be recorded.

State of Tennessee County of Davidson:

I know all men by these presents that I Benjamin Fanning make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others before at any time here before made to wit I then and desire my wife Julia Ann Wilson Thomas Fanning to have at my death the tracts of land on which I now live which I desire to be equally divided between my said wife Wilson Thomas there to be each of lands are bounded as follows to wit Beginning on a place South East corner of the tract running thence North $5\frac{1}{2}$ West crossing the river at 142 Poles in all 256 Poles to an oak on the North East bank of the River of Elk River thence South $84\frac{1}{2}$ West crossing the River at 30 Poles in all 116 Poles to a stake on the East Bank of said River thence South $12\frac{1}{2}$ West 32 Poles thence South 8° West 12 Poles South 13° West 10 Poles South 10° West 16 Poles South $11\frac{1}{2}$ West 18 Poles South 6° West 38 Poles South 5° East 54 Poles South 8° West 14 Poles South 17° West 34 Poles South 11° West 12 Poles South 15° West 3 Poles South 20° West 19 Poles to a stake thence to the beginning calculating by measurement 236 acres the following land to which is adjoined on the North East by the tract above described on the West and South by the lands of George Simmons the same is known as the still house tract the same having been purchased by me George Jacob Taylor & wife I desire that my wife Julia Ann Wilson Thomas have one half of the above described tract of land until her death then I desire my said son Thomas B. Fanning to have her part of said tract of land. 2nd I then and desire to my wife a negro girl Susan Wilson child of her late husband and I desire my said son Thomas B. Fanning to have said negro however I desire my said wife if she in her judgment should think proper to dispose of said negro as she may desire 3rd I then to my said wife one Bay mare 8 or 9 years old and also one brown mare 2 years old and one yoke of oxen always in good running order and condition and also the sheep that I now own and 4 head stock hogs and two choice hitch cows and my Buggy and harness and my thrasher and fan and my straw cutter and Corn Sheller and two good ploughs and two shovel ploughs two horse driven wagons plough and two turning ploughs and two houghs and a chain and one cross cut and a hand saw all among Christ's hand or to be on hand at my death.
