

All I desire is that A Harris of the County of Franklin in the of Tennessee should  
 will and memory to make and publish this my last will and testament  
 hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me made at  
 any other time. First I direct that my funeral expenses  
 and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out  
 of any moneys that I may die possessed of or may first come  
 into the hands of my executor secondly I will that my wife  
 Sarah have all the household and kitchen furniture that she  
 brought here with her or what she now claims as her own I  
 further will and desire that my Executor pay her four hundred  
 dollars out of any moneys that may come into his hands as my  
 executor 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my son B. F. Harris the  
 tract of land on which I now live containing two hundred  
 and twenty five acres out of which he must pay to my son  
 William these hundred dollars out of his own means I  
 further give to my son B. F. Harris to my two boys (to wit) Lewis  
 aged about 24 years & James aged about four months - 4<sup>th</sup> I  
 give and bequeath to my son William two negro boys (to wit)  
 Morton aged about 11 years & John aged about eight years  
 old 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret two negro  
 men or boys named Harry and one negro girl named Mary  
 6<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan one negro  
 boy named Samuel and one negro girl named Jane 7<sup>th</sup>  
 I have two other negro girls to wit Mary & Ellen which  
 if they are living at my death that my will bequeath  
 to that my son B. F. Harris take the said two negro  
 girls named Mary & Ellen at the sum of eight hundred  
 dollars which sum of money shall be for the benefit  
 and support of my two daughters Margaret & Susan to be used  
 by my said son B. F. at his discretion for their benefit &  
 support through life and after this it is my will and desire  
 that my son B. F. have the care of my daughters Margaret  
 Susan and the use of their property hereby conveyed for his  
 trouble and care of my said daughters during their natural  
 lives I further will that all the stock of horses cattle  
 hogs &c the first day my Executor with all the produce  
 of the farm for the support of the family that may survive  
 me. Nevertheless if there should be more stock or produce  
 of farm than shall be necessary for the support of the family  
 of the family that the surplus shall be sold by my Executor  
 at his discretion and the proceeds equally divided between  
 my children 8<sup>th</sup> As to my negro man Barna I desire to see  
 him myself but if I do not see him in my lifetime I  
 by his selling at my death my will is that he be sold  
 by the Executor either privately or at public sale as he  
 may think best and should there be any of the proceeds of the  
 sale left after paying debts to be paid by my Executor as  
 before named the balance shall be equally divided between

my children as before mentioned 9<sup>th</sup> Cuck lastly I do hereby  
 nominate and appoint my son B. F. Harris my Executor. In  
 witness whereof I do to this my last will and testament at this  
 27 day of February A.D. 1866

I Henry H. Elroy of the County of Franklin <sup>State of Tennessee</sup>  
 do hereby make this my last Will  
 and Testament Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give to my grand daughter for the  
 E. Angel and her children all my wearing clothes to have and  
 to hold forever Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I desire that my bed clothing  
 be equally divided between all my Grand Children Item  
 3 I desire that my cattle be sold to pay my debts and  
 my other and chaps all sold <sup>and</sup> of the property sold more  
 than pays all my debts and other expenses the remainder  
 of the money that arrives from the sale of my property  
 to be equally divided between all my Grand Children  
 Item 4 I appoint C. M. Newman to execute this my last  
 Will and Testament Item 5 I desire that if my lands and clothing  
 cannot be divided then they are to be sold by my Executor  
 and the money divided between my Grand Children  
 Item 6 I desire that here furniture a that I be equally  
 divided between my Grand Children and children what may be left  
 if it cannot be divided without selling them to be sold and  
 the money equally divided with my children Item 7 I desire that  
 all my property be sold on twelve months credit as usual when
