

Samuel D. Samuel Roseborough of Franklin County, County of the State of
 Ohio, a citizen of Franklin County, and desiring to make and ordain
 this my last Will and Testament in form following, witness,
 I give and command my said to the hands of Almighty God
 who gave it to my body to the earth to be buried in peace
 and my former aliments he paid out of the walls of my
 property but touching my worldly estate I still desire and leave all
 unto my wife Mary A. Roseborough the following property to wit
 all the houses and lots I now reside in in the town of Franklin
 forever which I bought from her late husband the 21st day of
 October 1846. I further give my wife the sum of \$1000 to
 the following slave one negro man named Robinson.
 Likewise all the furnishings on hand all the grain and
 provisions on hand also all the crop on my land not also
 live stock consisting of horses cattle and dogs. Likewise all
 my house goods and other furniture and all my and all
 my cooking utensils of unimpaired condition. Likewise my Bed
 and Brigg of hours and every clock together with all the Cloth
 and Clothing of myself and family except Nancy E. Brattin's clothing
 also all my bedsteads bed and furniture of the same class
 my wagon and wagon horses all my John and plow horses and
 all all my farming tools and utensils. Also my cotton
 spinning wheel and the rest of my household effects
 my said wife the following books being part of my library
 to wit Read Shakspeare's Merchant of Venice in three
 volumes Read James McPherson's Sermons in two volumes Read
 Doctor Shakespear's works and 3d & 4th volumes the first
 volume being lost Brattin's Dictionary of the Bible
 Evangelical Library fifteen volumes and my Family Bible
 and other Bibles books never before I give back by descent unto
 Nancy E. Brattin one time post master of Cherry tree
 made in Elizabeth Peppermans shop likewise one good leather
 bed and ~~and~~ ^{old} wooden bed boards two pillows and slats for the
 same also two good Calico quilts one good cotton Counter
 panes one blanket and two good sheets also one small Cherry
 Tree Table with a draw and glass knobs also one Cherry
 Tree bureau both made on Samuel Watson's shop also
 all the Clothing and School Books, I during adding a half
 Scholarship to the Half & Home Line if the endowed in the
 Cumberland Academy in Lebanon and it is well that the
 right of said Scholarship be not charged or transferred
 out of my family but that said right remain in my
 of spring forever and if more than one of my offspring
 should apply for admittance at one time such is my
 will that the Academy decide which shall be admitted first
 notwithstanding the fact to receive room for my Grandson Lewis
 P. Robinson who is now about ten or twelve years old so
 soon he shall be permitted to enter the Academy. It is also

my Will that a Certified Copy of this Clause of my Will be
sent to the family of said Estate and be placed in their
affidavit witness to still that being four acres $\frac{3}{4}$ of land
in Franklin County on the North Side of East River lying on
the Sulphur Branch, Beginning at James A Roseborough
North East corner in the North bound of said of Thomas
Hales 3000 acre tract running East with said line
Sixty poles to a stake thence South Sixty-four poles to a stake
and bearing now the Sulphur Branch thence West Sixty
poles to James A Roseborough's East boundary line thence North
Sixty-four poles with said line to the Beginning. In set
apart for the use of a common School to be kept on the
premises but to be more specific I have given ~~the~~ ^{the} sum of $\frac{1}{2}$ Dugue with
the above described parcel allotted to my Testator of much in
trust for the use and benefit of children in that neighborhood
that is to say he is to hold the the legal title to said land
giving the Common School Commissioners of that District
the sole management of the rents and profits ~~all~~ ^{of all} manner
of debts which may arise from said land who are hereby
instructed to use and apply the same to the use and benefit
of such school or schools as they may see proper to do
for others in the vicinity to go and be applied in the same
way anything that the common school fund is or
should the school be discontinued or withdrawn from that
place from any reason then out my Will that said land
be sold at such time as said trustee may suffice to
convene ^{at} place the proceeds in the hands of the County Audit
of Franklin County to become a part of the Common School
fund for said County and to be in the same way in every
particular that said common school fund governed by
the Laws of the State of Tennessee. I will that a piece
of land lying in Franklin County on the South Side of
East River Beginning at a post or on the bank of said East
River a corner of the tract of land that Judy Goopekin
lives on running down the river with its meanderings
round to a stake and another corner of the tract
of land that said Judy lives on thence South to the Beginning
supposed to be about fifty acres be sold and the proceeds
be equally divided into three equal parts ~~one~~ ^{one} third be
given to the American Bible Society and one third to the
American Home Missionary Society and the remaining third
be divided into two equal parts ~~one~~ ^{one} half of the same
be given to the Unionian Tract Society and the other
half to the Sabbath School mission. Having given to my
children ^{such portions} of my property and
estate as I still have after mentioned ~~the~~ ^{the} sum to their
several names ~~and~~ such parcels as I deem equalable ^{of equal}
to my son Edwin A Roseborough a tract of land

one hundred and forty nine acres worth one thousand and six hundred
 one cow and calf worth ten dollars one feather bed bedstead and
 furniture worth twenty five dollars to my son William
 Hale Roseborough two lots of land one hundred and twenty five
 acres worth one thousand and dollars one feather bed bedstead
 and furniture worth twenty five dollars the land of which
 one cow and calf and other articles worth fifty dollars to
 my son James A. Roseborough two lots of land containing one
 hundred and ninety acres worth one thousand and eighty six
 dollars one feather bed bedstead and furniture worth twenty
 five dollars one cow and calf worth ten dollars to my son
 Samuel A. Roseborough two lots of land containing about two
 hundred and twenty one acres also worth eight hundred and twenty
 eight dollars one feather bed bedstead and furniture worth
 twenty five dollars two cows and calves worth twenty dollars
 to my daughter Estelle McKnight one negro girl worth three
 hundred dollars one feather bed bedstead and furniture
 twenty five dollars one cow and calf some house hold and
 kitchen furniture worth twenty five dollars one mare saddle
 and bridle worth eighty dollars to my daughter Edna
 Parker one stock of land worth four hundred dollars
 one negro girl worth three hundred dollars one feather
 bed bedstead and furniture worth twenty five dollars and
 sundry house hold and kitchen furniture worth fifteen dollars
 to my daughter Jane C. Adams one mare saddle and bridle
 worth eighty dollars one negro girl worth three hundred
 dollars two feather beds bedsteads and furniture worth
 fifty dollars to my daughter Harriet L. Daniel the
 tract of land she now lives on worth three hundred
 dollars one negro boy worth four hundred dollars two
 feather beds bedsteads and furniture worth fifty dollars
 one mare saddle and bridle worth eighty dollars two cows
 and calves and one working animal worth twenty five dollars it is
 my will that the residue of my estate be sold after full
 privately as my executors may think best and that the
 proceeds of the sale together with such debts due me as
 my executors will be able to collect to appraise and as
 follows 1st that all my just debts be paid 2nd that the
 balance herein divided amongst those of my children
 named as follows Edwin A. Roseborough William H. Roseborough
 James A. Roseborough Samuel Roseborough Estelle McE.
 McKnight her Jane C. Adams and Anna Grace L.
 Daniel as to make them as near equal as practicable
 in the division to be together with the amount with the

amount given & acts one "thirtynone" & I wish that my
 two Slaves Es the ^W Jane Es theys Cheed and all their Children
 born after the date of this my last Will ^{my} Testamant go
 unto the hands of my friend Stephen Colyton whom I highly
 reccomend as to his old taste Chard of a dead Slave immediately
 after my death and here them back until they raised as
 freed sufficient to transport them to Africa in Africa
 and secure them comfortably in that Country under the regulations
 of the American Colonization Society and also to allow my said
 Trustee reasonable Compensation for his services ^{by} Month.
~~if~~ my said Trustee die before this trust is performed then I
 direct my Executor to execute this trust, said Slave to
 be free as soon as said fund alone is raised I do hereby make
 and appoint my esteemed friend ^W my beloved friend William Wickham Rivers
 my Executor of this my last Will ^{my} Testamant & Returns
 whereof I Samuel Roachborough the said Testator bore to this
 my last Will ^{my} Testamant but my name ^{is} seal this 28th
 day of October 1851

 estate after otherwise disposed of also the use of
 slaves my Gabriel, Hannah, Anna ^{my} Bum also ^{my} land
 and a pair of horses a cart and yoke of Oxen two hds
 hestnadoes ^{my} furniture three which are twenty five
 logs ^{my} as many of my forming utensils ^{my} as much
 kitchen furniture as she may need upon the further
 condition that my wife chose one of Andover during her
 life or widow hood our two grand children Anna and
 Rose ^{my} Nancy wife children of our daughter Polly Bell
