 to be sold by my Executors unless they and Matilda think it
 best in which case articles may be sold as they all
 agree to sell 4th I give and bequeath all my lands in Texas
 and also where to my son Erasmus and my daughter Matilda
 jointly estate and share alike 5th I appoint my friends
 Cephus Henderson and H. B. Stagner my Executors of this will not
