Schoep one bedstead furniture and one dresser or to my Sister Mrs. E. J. Jones and the remainder thereof to my friend Mrs. A. D. Shubert 3 I direct that one thousand dollars be expended by my Executor in enclosing the grave of my Mother and in buying a suitable monument or granite tablet therefor 4 I designate to the Legatee Executor of this two hundred dollars 5 I designate to Mrs. E. J. Shubert or his two hundred dollars 6 I direct that all the residue of my estate of every description be held by my Executor and used by him for the maintenance and support of my father R. D. Schoep as his necessities may require during his life and at his death I direct that whatever may remain thereof be equally divided amongst and shared alike amongst my Brothers and Sisters the children of deceased parents to receive what their parents if living would be entitled to. I appoint John F. Schoep Executor of this Will without surety this 1st January 1867.
