 share on the premises I have given & give with them the
 sheep & I wish to give & bequeath to him one horse
 one cow and two hogs the farming tools & Yards

all the Corn and fodder Bacon & I sold all the stock I have
also one Ark & Clothing & Bedstead &c. It is my will that
I should direct that whatever debt I may be owing at
the time of my death my funeral expenses be paid out
of the proceeds of the sale of property not given away
in this will & I further give & bequeath to my nephews
John J. & Robert H. Rogers the remainder of the proceeds of
said sale after the debts of my estate are paid & also
to them my Rail Road Stock I will that three fourths the shares
and that I do nominate Constable Whafford John J. Rogers my
Executor to this my last will and Testament in that case
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the

and the Provisions &c. I will 3rd It is my desire & will that
the remainder of my land off of the Mountain be divided
equally between James H. Shook Cynthia A. Landley wife
of James L. Landley & Dorah widow of O. S. Shook & I
I name my Executor to sell the same publicly or privately the
