that the balance of my estate viz 1/4 Lucy Ensey Siger Miss Mahola
Nancy and Delaplan out of their negroes my wife above named to
have her choice I desire that Enock Dorrith Anne Annis
Boris Downey & also Nancy Morrist agreeable to their contracts
with the Negroes and desire is that my wife above named shall have
half my corn at my decease growing or in the ear. 5th I desire of
my desire one that my wife the last named my two dearest
sons and the Legacies to draw for their dowries and lastly I do
hereby constitute and appoint my two sons John Enock & Andrew
H. Decker Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking
all other or former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made

 given her in case my beloved Wife Elizabeth should marry
 it is my Will that she shall have an equal share with
