a house one cow and Calf Bed and Furniture as they come of age
and what I have given to my children now grown & which
no charge made against them for that and if my wife should
die and leave any children under age not exceeding fifteen
of them one hundred dollars to be raised at the discretion
of my Executors there at the death of my wife and I have
all of my property Bonds Notes and accounts to be equally
divided between each my children without distinction by
a sale of all the property without exception at the discretion
of my Executors I bid adieu my wife Susannah Martin
and my son Thomas Martin and my daughter John Martin my
lawful Executors signed and sealed in presence of
witness

 one last of Jairies tools and set of turners tools and other articles that
 are not required for the due & late use of the family. I wish to
 be sold with the least possible delay the money therefrom
 put to interest which interest I wish to be appropriated to the
 use of the said Elizabeth and the above named children. The
 yearly interest I wish to be equally divided among the above named
 children 2⁴. It is my desire that the said Elizabeth shall have
 that tract of land that I purchased of Capt Williams before
 adjoining at George Allen Brooks tract of Land lying on upper
 Branches thereof during her natural life or widowhood as her
 death I wish the Land to be sold for Cash and equally divided
 among the surviving children I have about five hundred
 Dollars in notes and accounts that are due I wish them
 collected and invested in the same manner as the money
