 and memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament
 First I give and bequeath unto my Brother Robert Hudspeth one
 Negro man named Jacob now in the State of Georgia also
 one negro man named Andrew now in possession of Mother at
 her decease also one negro woman named Elizabeth and her
 increase also all the money arising from debts due me after
 my just debts are paid Secondly I request that my Executors
 herein after named will sell the residue of my Estate consisting
 of Slave Smith Tools horses Cattle and household furniture
 and that the amount arising from the Sales of said property
 be equally divided between my brother Robert Hudspeth
 my sister Mary Lawrence and my Brother Richard Hudspeth
 Lastly I appoint my Brother Robert Hudspeth Executor of
 this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former
 wills. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand

 this my last will and Testament in manner and form following:
 First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Abigail
 Woods the tract of land I now live on containing one hundred
 and thirty four acres with all the improvements thereto attached
 during her natural life I bequeath and it is my will that
 my beloved wife Abigail Woods hold during her natural life
 my negro man Jolly and his wife Betsey and their son named
 Richmond and all my household and kitchen furniture and
 farming tools with all of my stock of horses Cattle sheep and
 such part of my hog as belong to me now on said farm I do bequeath
 It is my will and desire that my two sons in law Charles
 Duncan and James McComb and their wives Mary and Susan
 and Susan a McComb and their children have no further
 division of my Estate I have given to them said two negro
 and their of an equal value that my Estate will move with
 the rest of my children I am that It is my will and
 desire that my three negro's named Aaron Jolly multi and
