free forever. I do furthermore bequeath to my two daughters
Elizabeth E. Rogers to be equally divided my other tract of land
it being the North West Quarter of Section thirteen township
seven Range two East in Madison County Alabama. Testimony
whereof I set my hand and seal this 24th day of August 1821

This 24th day of September 1828 the last will and Testament of
Thomas Jones was this day produced in open Court and the
Execution thereof being proven by the Oath of Elisha J. Dodson
The subscribing witnesses thereto was ordered to be recorded
Rachael Jones there applying for letters of Administration on
his estate that the said deceased ordered that she give Bond
and security in the full sum of Twelve thousand dollars
whereupon the said Rachael Jones together with Ezekiel
Key John P. Brown and Elisha J. Dodson her security entered
into bond in the penalty aforesaid conditioned as the Law directs
said security being by the Court here approved and the
said Rachael Jones having taken the Oath required by Law
It is ordered that letters of Administration with the will
annexed issue her accordingly
