 this my last Will and Testament recommit my soul to God
 who gave it and my body to the Grave to be buried in a decent
 and Christian like manner at the discretion of my surviving friends
 After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses all which
 I desire may be done as soon as possible or as circumstances
 may permit Secondly: I desire that my two youngest children
 Nancy & George who are yet under age may receive out of
 my personal property what may be an equal amount
 to each one to what any of my other children has received
 of me. Thirdly that my beloved wife Elizabeth may be
 plentiful and suitably supported during her Natural life or
 widowhood out of my substance she retaining all the estate
 during her Natural life or widowhood. Fourthly I desire that
 my two youngest children Nancy and George may be supported
 till they are of age. Fifthly I desire that my four sons John
 Thomas William & George have the said it being
 equally divided between between them after the death or
 marriage of my beloved wife Sixthly I desire that all my
 personal property and the increase of the same that may exist
 at the death of my beloved wife may then be equally divided
 between my three daughters Jane, Elizabeth, & Mary Seventhly
 I desire that the form may be so arranged that it may properly
 & sparingly support itself without the use of any of the other
 property in improving the land or buildings and lastly I appoint
 my beloved wife Elizabeth Executor and my son Thomas
 & Execution of this my last Will and Testament removing all
 other Wills or testaments by me made or witnessed whereof
 I hereunto set my hand and seal this the eighth day of
 November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and thirty two

 G. Kennedy the Executors therein named came into open Court and
 was qualified as Executors of the said deceased and entered into
 Bond with William H. Murray John W. Anderson & J. A. Rutherford

at the discretion of my friends and after discharging of my personal
affairs and all my just debts which it is just and then of great
magnitude all of which it is my desire may be punctually
paid and that without delay the residue of my estate both
real and personal I give and bequeath in the following manner
I do my beloved wife Elizabeth Sandlin I give and bequeath
all of my stock of animals all of my household and kitchen furniture
and every thing during her natural life and the plantation I now live on with
all the appurtenances thereto but on going with the farming tools &c.
the negro woman Edy, I leave at the discretion of my wife to dispose
of her as she may think proper should she think proper to sell her at
her may wish the proceeds of the sale to go to my Grandson
James Sandlin and at the decease of my wife all the property
that may be remaining or on hand together with all debts that
may be owing and the land I now live on containing one hundred
and twenty three and a half acres I give and bequeath to the before
mentioned Grandson James Sandlin son of William Sandlin
who I have principally raised from a infant at the same
time I request that that the before mentioned James may strictly
attend to the plantation & and in particular to my wife's son
William Sandlin I leave the plantation he is now on and to his
wife Mary Sandlin during this life the old survey containing 170
acres with an addition by survey of 100 acres by the said William
paying to his brother John Sandlin should he ever receive all or nine
one hundred dollars then the one hundred acre survey to be sold
to raise the said hundred dollars if the said survey will sell
for that if not the the amount it brings and at the decease of the
said William Mary it is my desire the land may be sold and the
proceeds equally divided among his children & my nephew who
is now in my family and who I have not thought of until in this
