

Conveyance of Land in Transler County for which grants have
as yet been obtained but which my Executors are hereby directed
to obtain. I Deed from George H. Higgins and wife and Stephen Cook
and wife to Joseph Klippel for Lot 230 15 in the town of Bellefontaine
Jackson County Alabama registered in the proper office in Alabama
19 April 1838. I further direct that they give three months Public
notice of the day and place of sale and that they sell the same on a
credit of twelve months and any other real estate not named.
Fifthly I further direct that my Executors after all my just debts
and funeral and Testamentary expenses have been paid and all my
own accounts &c have been collected and the proceeds of the sale of my
real and personal estate at all have been turned into money
distributed the whole in the following manner. Sixthly: To the
children male and female of my Brother Jacob Klippel (who now
lives in Washington County Tennessee) in living at the time of my
death and to the children of my Brother John Klippel (who was at
the time of his decease living in Washington County Tennessee)
in living at the time of my decease above and above also - and
to their heirs forever respectively. Seventhly I further direct that
the above of each child be paid to him or her if he or she be of
age if not that it be paid to their father or mother or guardian &c in the
same. Eighthly, I direct and direct that the fourth of my estate
real or personal or of my effects of my due capital be paid on
given or bequeathed to any person or persons except the said
above named children in living at the time of my death of
my Brother Jacob Klippel and of my deceased Brother John Klippel
which is said above children. I hereby constitute, select and
appoint to be my only legal heirs and representatives. Ninthly
I nominate my Brother Jacob Klippel and my friend Thomas Taylor
of Winchester Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. In

this paper this 4th day of February 1838

again at the general Resurrection, Secondly as to my worldly estate
wherein with it has pleased God to bless me after paying all my
just debts, I give to my beloved wife Sarah Lesater whom
I appoint my executrix with my Father Hydrat Lesater and my
Brother Abner Lesater Executors for her use and the raising
and schooling of my children during her widowhood. Provided
she does not waste the same to be adjudged of by my other
Executors and further should she marry to keep the same for
the use of my children if provided it be applied in a proper
manner for the raising and schooling my children as aforesaid
and aforesaid Executors should not think that they who will
forested as they ought to be there for her to take her third part
remains the balance to be equally divided amongst my children
tasting unto consideration thus again and schooling And if my beloved
wife Sarah Lesater should die before my children be all
grown my other Executors to act and to getting their houses
And the schooling of said children and further should one
of my Executors die ~~before~~ wife Sarah and the other to choose
another and provided they both should die the County Court
to appoint some suitable persons to act in their places, Agreed
