

I Thomas Harsfield of the County of Franklin and State of
 Tennessee being of sound mind and memory make and publish
 this my last Will and Testament 1st I give and bequeath to
 my Wife Fannin a good stone named a bull Bedstead
 a wooden a sugar chest a brass kettle a spice mortar
 a box a set of silver 20 spoons a set of cups and
 saucers a single seat a set of plates a set of chairs
 a flap stool to hold and to hold for her separate
 use during her life time at the death of my wife Fannin
 that said stone & other property I be sold and the proceeds
 equally divided among my daughters 2nd I give to my
 son Hamilton a negro boy named Ben to be valued and
 accounted for out of his part of my estate 2nd I give
 to my son Henry Nelson one hundred and ninety one acres
 of land lying at the North East side of the tract upon
 which I now live also one bed & furniture to have and
 to hold said land & articles for his separate use during
 his life remain to his children should he die
 without children I will that said land be sold & equally
 divided among his three Brothers Samuel Harsfield
 Thomas Harsfield & Joseph Harsfield 4th I give to Flora
 Porter wife of Robert Porter my negro girl named
 Sandy & her increase to have and to hold said stone
 & her increase for her separate use during her life &
 at her death to go to the children of said Flora 5th I
 give to Peggy Smith wife of Jackson Smith my negro
 girl named Vera & her increase to have and to hold
 for her separate use during her life and at her death to go
 to her children 6th I give to John Mosley and his heirs forever
 a man stone named Andy and a woman named Mary
 wife of Andy & her increase 7th I give to Nancy Johnson
 daughter of John Johnson and Mary George Johnson children of Lucy
 Johnson deceased and their heirs forever a stone named Ashley
 8th I give to George Mosley and his heirs forever the following
 slaves Rose James Es & her children Elyah James & Leah
 & her baby named Elony & their increase being two shares
 of my estate but I bid George Mosley is to account
 to my Grand daughter Elony Ann Mosley wife of George
 Mosley at the death of her Mother for one share in value
 of my estate 9th I give to Thomas Harsfield and his heirs
 forever one half of the tract of land upon which I
 now live beginning at the and running a North East course
 eye chiding the place whereon he now lives this is to
 be his lifetime share of my estate the half of the tract is
 hereby given to Thomas to be the half of the remainder
 of the tract after giving to Henry Nelson his tract of
 191 acres 10th I direct my Executors to select three
 disinterested men to value all the above negroes

to my children and they are to account for them & share out
of their shares of my Estate. 11th I have heretofore given to
my Son Joseph Hassefied his full share of my Estate
in a negro Girl in money & the property & he is now
to have one dollar only. 12th I will that no one of the
negroes herein bequeathed go to the mainland without his
or her consent unless those to whom they are given should
more than 13th I have here to fore given to my Son
Hamilton a tract of land I bought from John McIlhenny
& Hamilton is to be charged with what it cost to the land
until he 13th I wish my Executors to see the value
of my Land & all other property I may have not herein
disposed of and make an equal division of the same
between the following of my Children sharing then with
what property I have heretofore given them to wit
Hamilton for a Poss. Peggy Smith Jane Goodwin the
wife of Nancy Johnson and George Mosley two shares
John Mosley one hundred dollars to be deducted from
the share of Jane Goodwin & fifty dollars from the share
of Peggy Smith with that deduction the divisions to be
equally amongst my children above named. 14th Lastly
I promulgate my last will & appoint my son Hamilton Hassefied
& my Grand Son Thomas & Mosley Executors of this my last
will & Testament. Given under my hand & seal this
5th day of September 1843
