 plantation lying in the County of Washington my estate of Virginia
 adjoining the lands of James Moore and known as the Deffen
 Farm for and in consideration of which devise to my said
 niece E. H. White I require her to pay to my nephew William White
 the sum of One Thousand Dollars which said sum I give and
 bequeath to him. To Nelson Preston I give and bequeath the
 sum of One Thousand Dollars and a certain note for the sum
 of Five Hundred Dollars executed by him to me. To James H.
 Preston and Elizabeth Edmiston I give and bequeath each
 one Thousand Dollars. I give and bequeath to my nephew
 William White the sum of One Thousand
 Dollars and I appoint the said William H. White Trustee to
 receive and manage the said bequest for her use and benefit.
 To Ellen daughter of my nephew Thomas H. White I give and bequeath
 the sum of One Thousand Dollars and I appoint the said Thomas
 H. White Trustee to receive and manage the said bequest
 for her use and benefit. I give and bequeath to Ellen H.
 daughter of my nephew James H. Preston the sum of one
 Thousand Dollars and I appoint the said James H. Preston
 Trustee to receive and manage the said bequest for her
 use and benefit. I desire and direct that the proceeds
 of two notes now owing to me by John Dougherty and
 William be applied to the payment of the three last foregoing
 bequests. That the deferring be made up and applied
 to the payment of the same from other portions of my
 estate not otherwise herein devised. To my niece James
 H. Humes I give and bequeath my carriage and carriage
 horses. The said carriage and carriage horses not to be
 liable for the payment of any debts now owing or hereafter
 contracted by her husband John H. Humes. The bequest
 is made for her own use and benefit. To the three children
 of my brother William Wilson I give and bequeath each two
 Thousand Dollars. As it is my desire that my nephew
 Henry may have upon which to pay the redemption
 himself from above said by the payment of five hundred
 dollars as is otherwise provided for. I shall give hundred
 dollars as accruing from the land or source of the said
 boy's farm. I give and bequeath to my nephew J. H. White
 to father an additional sum of five hundred dollars to
 be paid from such portion of my estate as is not herein
 otherwise devised. If the said boy's farm shall come into
 my hands during my life it is to have the advantage of
 the above provisions. I give and bequeath to my nephew
 Addison White the sum of One Thousand Dollars. To my
 niece Kathleen daughter of Wm. E. Humes I bequeath
 and give the sum of One Thousand dollars to be paid her
