wife Polly full authority and do direct that she sell to John Tully the
tract of land on which I now live for one horse and one hundred
Dollars to be paid to Joseph Brown and fifty Dollars part in money
the last in Cattle. I give to my wife Polly the horse which she
laid claim for as well as the cattle that comes with the horses
I direct that my wife sell the plow one axe 1 for Gees 2 anthonias
and such other horses as she may not want for herself and the children
I direct that my wife Polly to sell two shillings to Capt. Hale and
to sell the chairs all that goes to sell my Razors and to sell the
loom of she plow or scyphit for himself to sell a big logshed and
the money of all these sales to go to the payment of my debts
and remainder of the money and all the property my wife to have
to maintain the children until at her discretion

In the name of God Amen, I thusfield Shropshire of perfect
mind and memory do by these presents as touching such personal
goods and chattels whereof I am possessed signify & make known
this my last Will and Testament Reserving first & giving away all others
hereunto made either written or noncupative and first of all
I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to my
Mother Earth knowing that it is appointed once for all men to die
I therefore require my Executor that I have Christian Burial & be
consigned directly to the Earth. Item 1st and next to Burial
it is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be
discharged of my nature whatever Item 2nd I give and bequeath
to Catherine Shropshire my much beloved wife the negro servant
Nannah and her three children Baldwin & Isabell Henry & Henry
& her three children Jacob Tom & Martin & Sarah also young horses
cattle & hogs my household and kitchen furniture as well as all
my wounding tools & all my out standing debts of every description
whatever I had during her natural life or widowhood whom
also I appoint sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament
& in case of death or infirmary to act & appoint my son James
(Shropshire) Executor in his place Item 3rd I give and bequeath
to my daughter Lucy Shropshire one negro girl named Debbie
to be held back from this share when made equal with the
rest at a division of her mothers legacy either at her death
or second marriage as I have made no separate allowance
to any but her but have allowed her this girl over & when
the Division takes place for her to have that much less
than the rest - Item 4th It is my will that after the death
of my much beloved wife Catharine aforesaid my property

be equally divided amongst my children as follows to wit
Either by lot or sale as they may best & first James H.
Shropshire Betsy Townsend John Shropshire whose condition
situation being affected with fits & being such as require by
reason thereof much care therefore who among his Brothers
& Sisters will take care of him shall be entitled to his share
for them so doing is I sincerely provided he should not have
his Mother Nancy Shropshire Sabina Shropshire Pamela Shropshire
Joseph Shropshire & Polly his first wife Shropshire to be paid him as
they come to age or in any " In Testimony whereof I do
hereby on the 2nd day of May in the year of our Lord 1846
do declare make & renew sign & seal this as my last Will
and Testament & none other in the presence of the following
persons here present signed it myself & acknowledged it hereby

but of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God

Callie Tally all my Estate both real & personal of every description
and kind of property all my part of my said Father John Tally
leaves also all the part of William Tally Deed which he and
William Tally gave and bequeathed unto me by their both real
and personal property of every description I & other one negro girl
named Shirley after the death of my brother Rebekah Tally and
by no cause of any sorte & Shirley may have while in the
service of my said mother Rebekah Tally with all monies and
property of every description I have possessed of or may or may
have any claim on or to after giving my Sister Rebekah Tally
one wooden chest one box which what is left and Cotton & bone
now on hand one Dutch oven and Spoon with all pertaining to the
same - my next want is my just debts to be paid
out of the sales of my payable property and funeral expenses
and the sale of the before mentioned payable property and
Movable to take place as soon as possible after my decease
My next wish is in case my only son Leslie Tally should
not live to the years of majority or marriage to provide or enjoy
my before mentioned Estate and property that the whole of my said
estate both real and personal should be divided between my daughter
Rebekah Tally and Brother Samuel Tally so as to give Samuel Tally
