do make and publish this my last Will & Testament
sincerely desiring and making void all other Wills by me at
any time made. First I desire it that my general Expenses
and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible
out of any monies that I may die possessed of: or may first
come into the hands of my Executor. Secondly I give & bequeath
to my wife Margaret the batch of land I now occupy during her
life & at her death to my son James. Thirdly I will &
bequeath to my daughter Sarah Corbitt one horse best
of common value & saddle & bridle one cow & calf of
common value & one bed & furniture. Fourthly I will
& bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one horse the best of
common value saddle & bridle & one cow & calf of
common value & one bed & furniture. I will & bequeath
to my daughters Sarah Corbitt & Elizabeth one sideboard
& bureau and want them to have all the above named
things when they arrive to the age of Eighteen years or
when they marry. The balance of my property I leave to my wife
& I wish nothing to be sold if my debts can be paid
otherwise. I want all to remain in the hands of my
wife during her life & whatever may be in her hands
at her death I wish to be divided equally between my afore-
mentioned daughters Sarah Corbitt & Elizabeth. I do
do nominate and appoint J. H. Murree & Reuben Stumiller
my Executors in which whereby I do to this my Will set
my hand & seal this twenty first day of Oct. 1841

I Lousie Ragan make this my last will and Testament:
I give unto my son Bailey Ragan and Mary his wife during
their natural lives the part of land on which I now live
and at their deaths it is my will that the said land
be sold and the proceeds of the sale equally divided between
the lawful heirs of that body and both of said daughters
one hundred and eighty six acres. I have here before given
my daughter Sally Threlby and Agnes shares as much of my
estate as I intended them and their husbands can keep
what I have given them respectively I give my daughter
Francis Rolleston and her two daughters Katharine and
one her furniture one new chopping ax one new
winding bob four head of sheep or their value in other
property if they do not choose to take sheep one cow and
calf or sheep with calf. I give to John Thoms my
Grandson one hundred and fifty acres of land lying
in the Cumberland mountains in the town of Horstone
I appoint Matthew Ragan and T. A. Bruden my Executors
to this my will. I hereby revoke all other wills, signed
sealed or acknowledged this the 30th day of June 1842
