I have one hundred fifty loads of corn he set apart for
the use of my family jointly except my son James who
has been provided for already to the full amount of his share
of it I therefore bequeath that my son James of Morton to sell his
stock now on hand, upon my premises is as to correspond
with the amount the family jointly as above provided for
I will that the remainder of my estate with wagon buggy
& harness farming utensils & such the balance of the estate
and he sold and the proceeds of said sale together with
the balance of cash on hand be divided equally among my
four daughters Elizabeth Grace is Mary Margaret & Maria
I will that my family together at heretofore and all
that is hereafter made up on the farm to be equally
divided among the members of the family after a support
all necessary family expenses is paid as long as they
see proper to retain my confidence in the honesty
of my friends & estate of J. Morton I hereby constitute
and appoint him my executor to carry that my will and
testament into effect given under my hand this 9
day of August 1862
