 it is appointed unto all men once to die in order and to obtain this my
 last Will and Testament (viz) I Will that all my just debts be lawfully
 paid: 1st I Will and bequeath to my son Richard and James Shoop all the
 tract of Land I now have on containing one hundred and fifty acres
 Also to my son Richard and James Shoop a negro woman named
 Shirley. Also I give unto my son Richard Shoop four negro
 mules by the names of Hannah, Milley, Charles and Donald and one
 horse bridle and saddle one feather bed and cow and calf: I give
 unto my son James Shoop one negro boy named Harry
 three hundred dollars in cash and horse bridle and saddle one
 feather bed and bow & calf. I give unto my son James Shoop
 one negro boy named Harry three hundred dollars in cash and horse
 bridle and saddle one feather bed and cow and calf: I give unto
 my son William Shoop four negro mules two named Peter one
 three is one Jimmy one horse bridle and saddle one feather bed cow
 and calf. I give unto my son Robert Shoop the tract of land
 thereof he now has worth one thousand dollars one negro boy
 named Jacob one more bridle and saddle one feather bed one cow
 and calf and one hundred and eight dollars in cash: I give to
 my daughter Margaret the tract of land there on she now
 has containing eighty acres three negro mules named Shelly, Jimmy
 and George two horses four cows and calves one bed and furniture
 I give unto my son in Law William Loom four negro mules
 named Harriet Violet Ralph Aaron and one bridle and saddle one feather
 bed one cow and calf two hundred and fifty dollars in cash
 and rifle Gun: I give unto my son in Law John Hayes one
 more bridle and saddle one feather bed two dollars in cash and
 one dollar: I give unto my Grand daughter Phanny Adams one
 negro girl named Sally and feather bed and cow and calf one
 horse and Comyall: I give unto my Grand daughter Anna
 Durall one horse bridle and saddle worth one hundred dollars one
 feather bed and bedstead and furniture: I give unto my son in Law
 Abner Laska one negro woman named Hannah and one more
 bridle and saddle one feather bed one cow and calf and one dollar I give
 unto my Grand daughter Mary Laska one negro girl named
 Sybil: I give unto my three Grand sons James, Robert, and
 Richard Laska one hundred dollars each to be paid out of the
 Estate: All the property that is not specified in this my last
 Will is to be read and equally divided between my three children
 Richard James William, Robert Margaret and Ann Lydia hereby
 renounce and appoint my sons Richard and James Shoop my Executors
 of this my last Will and Testament, Reserving all others by me
 heretofore made both written and verbal to Justifying and Confirming
 this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have
 hereunto set my name and affixed my seal this 4th day
 of Nov 18 36 This also my Will that if any of my Grand

 things or window hood and then the land to belong to my beloved
 son Robert by his paying all my beloved daughter one hundred
 doles one aprice negro Bob and the rest of the property at the death of
 my beloved wife is to be sold and equally divided amongst my
 son and daughter except Liza should be kept in the family
 either by sale or hire. It is also my will that all the property that is
 not mentioned in the will shall be sold on twelve months credit
 and to be equally divided amongst my beloved children. It is also
 my will that all the money that will be over defraying all my
 demands should also be equally divided at my death. This also
