

I William Trigg of Transylvania County and State of Tennessee
 being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and
 testament thus it 1st I give unto my wife Susan Trigg the tract
 of land on which I live & a tract of land I bought of Alfred
 Henderson also as much corn feed horses dogs cattle and sheep
 as my Executors may think necessary for her to keep on the farm
 also all my negroes not otherwise disposed of in this will all of
 said property I give to her during her Natural life or the dow
 hood and after her death or marriage to be equally divided amongst
 my children I also hereby give her Liberty to use the land
 should she think proper and buy a new place the balance
 after paying for it to belong to my children & the land bought
 to be disposed of in the same way I have directed the land on
 which I live " 2nd I give to my son James my house
 and lot in Salem also the following negroes with Melvina
 and her son Tom Jim & Murky also one horse saddle & Bridle
 to be worth one hundred & twenty five Dollars to him and his
 heirs forever also my Secatory and clothes & saddle 3rd I give
 to my daughter Isabella the following negroes to wit Edmund her
 child Calvin also Sam Myra and Mahota and their increase also
 one horse saddle & Bridle to be worth one hundred and twenty
 five Dollars to her and her heirs forever 4th I give unto my son
 Thiers the following negroes to wit Frank Stephen Smith Ned
 Eddie & Moses & their increase also one horse saddle and Bridle
 to be worth one hundred and twenty five Dollars to her and
 her heirs forever 5th I give to my son Morshane the
 following negroes to wit Billy and Luthie Abram Albert and
 Horrett with their increase also one horse saddle and
 Bridle to be worth one hundred and twenty five Dollars
 to him and his heirs forever 6th I give to my son Abandon the
 following negroes to wit Leah and Polly John Mary and their
 increase also one horse saddle and Bridle to be worth one
 hundred & twenty five Dollars to him and his heirs forever.
 7th I give to my daughter Mary Ann the following negroes to wit
 little Jimmy Sherry & Fanny and her child and their increase
 also one horse saddle and Bridle worth one hundred and
 twenty five Dollars to her and her heirs forever 8th I give
 to Elizabeth Thoburn one negro woman named Easter & her increase
 provided she Dorothy shall succeed in recovering in the
 suit she has brought against her husband not otherwise.
 9th after complying with all the gifts herein I wish my
 Executors to sell the balance of my property where it can
 be sold to see me pay all my just bills the balance
 remaining after paying so to be equally divided amongst
 all my children I also wish that they be immediately left in
 my debt 10th I wish my business with the Survivors
 settled as soon as possible & that he be permitted to keep
 what may be coming to me by paying six per cent per

assure interest on the same until a debt now depending
 between John Dougherty is determined & should Dougherty
 succeed for him to be paid out if it if not for it to be paid any
 divided among my children. 11th I should my Brother Haden &
 Trigg be unable to make the payment for his land I request my
 Executors to loan him as much money as will pay what he may
 not be able to is able to be repaid as soon as possible without
 interest. 12th I nominate & appoint More (Hutchins Guordian for my
 son James also John Summons for my son William also Horsham
 St Russell for my son Morsham & my Daughter Isabelle & my Ann
 also John R Patrick for my son Alanson. 13th I want my sons
 James William Morsham & Alanson to receive this property at
 the age of Twenty years also my Daughter Isabelle & my Ann
 at the age of Twenty or sooner should they marry. 14th It is
 my wish that should any of the negroes given to any of my
 children die before they become Twenty years that the value
 up to them unless they increase. whatever he left may be
 equal to the others in value. 15th and lastly, I nominate &
 appoint Morsham St Russell John Summons and John R Patrick Executors
 of this my last will and Testament. Given under my hand

The last emancipation will of Thomas & Horne did make in the month
 of October 1827 in the presence of the undersigned Richard C. Lecher
 & Charles J. Gillespie witnesses who as before said, called upon
 the deponents then being of sound mind and memory, to bear
 witness that such was his will which will was made
 in his last sickness, in less than two weeks before his death
 at the house of Thomas Shapton in Salem where he had been
 resident about three months immediately previous to his
 death the said Thomas had no family or fixed place of residence
 but alternately resided at Salem and at Clermont Springs in
 Alabama he was taken sick in Salem and was confirmed there
