I do also desire after my death that my negro man Sam. shall be set free. I also give and devise unto my negro man Sam. after my death a certain tract or parcel of land containing fifteen acres siting in Trainger County on the north side of Neale's river— Beginning at a point on McKiney's line near the road leading from Davis Sharps to McKiney's, this tract of land Sam. is to have and to hold to his lifetime— Also after my death all my real estate and personal property, goods and chattles to be equally divided between the rest of the heirs. Also I hereby appoint my son Thomas Hankins and John Large sole Executors of my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
