The undersigned having been appointed by Order of the Court of Pleas and Justice Sessions of Said County at this August Term 1835 to call on the Commissioners who were appointed to lay off and apportion to Jane Brown widow of John Brown a years support of the provisions &c. on hand & inquire of them whether at the time of laying off said support they regarded William A. Brown as one of the family and if they did regard him as such then 2^d inquire what was the probable value in cash of the property so laid off and make report to this Court.

In pursuance of said Order the undersigned on the 14th Day of the present Instant at the Dwelling house of Nicholas Caunto and called on said Caunto and Jacob Kline two of the Commissioners aforesaid who after being duly sworn were interrogated & examined jointly & who state that they have not a distinct recollection of the particular circumstances of that transaction. They do not remember now whether they then regarded William A. Brown as one of the family or not nor do they recollect whether they then had any knowledge of his having left the family with an intention not to return there to live. Mr. Kline says that on the day that the years support was laid off & he believes after it was laid off he heard the widow Brown ask William why he did not come to see her and that William answered that he would not let her but Kline does not know who William alluded to that would not let him come.

The account of the articles assigned for the support of Jane Brown & family according to the best recollection of said Commissioners was follows.
