

Commissioners Report.

State of Tennessee & Gaughran Gaughran & We Isaac Barton Obadiak Broz John Cantely James Shields and John Robertson appointed by the Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions of said County as Commissioners to make partition of the lands & Estate of John Moffet late of said County died having been duly sworn proceeded to employ Joseph Cobb Esq. to make the necessary surveys the surveyor appointed by the Court having failed to attend and then proceeded to make partition and allotment in manner and form as follows. Viz. We allot and appropriate to Elmore Shannon formerly Elmore Moffet widow of John Moffet Esq. on her answer land a certain a certain tract or parcel of Land being part of the lands of the said John Moffet Esq. & lying & being in the County of Grainger as aforesaid on the waters of Cedar Creek. The said Downer line is bounded as follows viz. BEGINNING in the head of a big Spring & running down the middle of the Spring Branch four poles thence South Eighty two and a half degrees West seven poles to a large forked White oak then South Seventy one West Forty three poles to two Sassafras then South Seventy nine West Seventy seven poles to a Stake on Moffets Seventy six acre tract then North Forty five West Forty two poles to three post Oaks then North Twenty poles to a Hickory. East Sixty poles to a Stake North Sixty poles to a Stake Original Beginning of the above Survey six acre tract then East Two Hundred & twenty eight poles to a Stake on the line of Moffets four Hundred acre tract. Do constitute and assign the following to be my last Will and Testament and hereby revoking all or any other heretofore by me made or supposed to be made. And last I hereby give and recommend my Soul to God who gave it and my body to a decent Christian burial in a sure and certain hope of a resurrection thereof and as to the Goods & Chattels and Real Estate with which it hath pleased God to bless me it is my last will and desire it shall be disposed of as follows of the all my just debts & expenses are as paid out of the same my will is that the remainders shall be disposed of in the following manner to wit, I will and bequeath the tract of Land with the Entry belonging to the same that I now live on to my beloved wife Elizabeth with all the Stock horses Cattle Sheep and hogs Farming tools house hold and Kitchen Furniture that My son may think necessary for the support of ~~my~~ family that I leave with her during her natural life or her widowhood I further will my beloved wife three Hundred Dollars in Cash.
