DATE OF BILL, PROCESS, &c.

Charles Tiegan

In the name of God Amen.
I Charles Tiegan of the County of Greene
and State of Tennessee being infirm
in body but of perfect mind and memory
Thanks be to God, calling into mind
The mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed unto all men once
to die do make ordain and declare
this instrument my last will and
testament revoking all others
It is my will that all my just debts
be putrally and speedily paid and the
remainder of my estate I dispose of
in the following manner.

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto
my well beloved wife Martha Tiegan
Two negro girls Philis and Sara one
Lass and Bodle two milch cows
and all my house hold and kitchen
furniture of every description during
her Natural life and it is my
will that she remain in possession
of all my real and personal estate
during her widow hood but if she
should marry my Executor is required
to proceed immediately to dispose of
that part not left to her during her
life in the manner here in after
directed and to leave the above named
negro girl Philis and Sara now in the
possession of Joseph Stacker and un-
reasonably with held from me by him
The said Joseph my son William
Tiegan is requested after my decease
to use all lawful means in his
power to recover said negroes

and if he should succeed in recovering them from the said racket they are to remain in possession of my wife Martha Fiegare during her natural life and at her death I give and bequeath the said negroes to him the said William Fiegare and his heirs forever.

Item 2nd I give and ^{bequeath to} my daughter Mary Colburn one negro girl called Delilah and her heirs forever.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Osher two negro girls Nester and Delila with all their increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Walker two negro girls Puy & Kate with all their increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my son William Fiegare my negro woman Lancer and her increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my son John Fiegare at the decease of my wife Martha Fiegare my negro boy Elisha to him and his heirs forever.

Item 7th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Bora Smith Henderson one negro boy called Allen which she has already secured to her and her heirs forever.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my son-in-law Joseph Walker one negro boy called George which he has already secured to him and his heirs forever.

Item 9th I give and bequeath unto my son James Fiegare one negro boy

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I join together with the plantation whereon
of Row line which he is to receive at
the decease of my wife Martha Kilgore
to him and his heirs forever.
Item 10th It is my will that all my
Estate which may remain at the de-
cease of my wife Martha Kilgore be
sold and the monies arising from
said sale after paying William Kilgore
and John M. Kilgore one hundred
and fifty dollars each to be equally
divided between my three sons William
Kilgore, John M. Kilgore and James Kilgore
and it is my will that if any Negro
be sold that same of my own connection
purchase them.

Item 11th It is my will that my neg-
ro woman Beliah for her lang and
faithfull service receive her freedom
immediatly after my decease and that
my Mulato girl Rachel receive her
freedom at the age of twenty years
and my Negro girl Peg receive her
freedom at the age of twenty five.
And Lastly. I do hereby constitute and
appoint my son John M. Kilgore and
John Gigg my Executors to execute this
my last will and Testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal the 6th day of June, 1822,
