I give and recommend my soul to God or to whom it may Truly Hoping through the merits of my Blood Saviour for a Full Pardon and Remission of my Sins and my body to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named —
I then I give all the tract of land whereon I now Live to my well beloved Wife Margaret and all the stock of horses cattle, Hogs &c during her life or widowhood the land not to be sold as long as my wife Lives
I then I give twenty pounds to my son John Smith to be paid out of my Estate when sold, also give my son Robert twenty Pounds to be paid out of my Estate when sold —
Also give ten Pounds a Piece to my three daughters to wit Ann Smith Margaret Smith & Jane Smith and the remainder Part of any be-
neger my desire that if should be equally divided between James Smith, Charles Smith, Daniel & William Smith only deducting twenty Pounds out of Charles Smith Port and Lot —
I constitute James & Charles Smith my Executors of this my Last will and Testament Revoking and annulling all others by me made in witness my hand and Seal this 13th day of December, 1797. —

I further give and bequeath unto my beloved son John Shaw of Loudon County, Virginia a horse & bridle to be worth forty Dollars the remainder of my Estate I give to be equally divided between my ^{beloved} sons Benjamin Shaw, Joseph Shaw, Jesse Shaw, and my beloved daughter Betsey Shaw I do appoint my beloved wife Fanny Shaw and my beloved son Benjamin Shaw to Execute this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand & seal, my seal this nineteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight.
