surplus money not appropriated, I
give and bequeath to my Son Thomas
Temple.

Item. I constitute and appoint my Son
Thomas Temple and Valentine Levier,
Executors of this my Will.

2nd day of January 1818.

In the name of God Amen I George
Thompson of the State of Tennessee Green
County being very sick and weak in
(or perfect health of) body but (or and) of perfect
mind and memory, thank be giving unto

God bealing unto mind the mortality of my
 body and knowing that it is appointed for all
 men once to die do make and ordain this my
 last will and testament that is to say
 principally and first of all I gave and my
 soul into the hands of almighty God that gave
 it and my body I recommend to the earth
 to be buried in decent Christian burial
 at the discretion of my executors Mary
 Thompson and Jacob Dorman nothing
 doubting but at the general resurrection I
 shall receive the same again by the
 mighty power of God and as touching such
 worldly estate wherewith it has pleased
 God to bless me in this life I gave demise
 and dispose of the same in the following
 manner and form
 first I gave and bequeath to Mary my
 dearly beloved wife the plantation as long
 as she lives and at her death to be sold
 and equally divided amongst all my heirs
 excepting my daughter Mary also I gave to my
 well beloved daughter Mary one lot when
 shee marries likewise all the moveable
 property must be sold to discharge all
 my lawful debts and the remaining
 to be equally divided amongst all my
 heirs except my daughter Mary
 likewise I gave to my dearly beloved
 son James the bay horse colts that was
 banded his likewise constitute
 make and ordain the sole
 executrix of this last will and
 testament all and singular my
 lands messuages and tenements by
 them freely to be possessed and enjoyed
 and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke
 and disannul all and every
 other former testament wills legacies
 bequests and executors by me in
 any wise before named made
 and bequeathed ratifying and

confirming this and no other to be my
last Will and testament in witness
whereof I have here to fore set my hand
and seal this seventh day of May in
the year of our lord one thousand eight
hundred and seven
