 Twenty One make and publish this my last
 will and Testament and manner & form
 facing that is to say first I commend
 my soul to God who gave it and my
 body to the earth again to be buried
 in a decent & orderly manner & that
 all my funeral expenses be paid out
 of my Estate -

I also will that all my just debts be
 faithfully paid out of my Estate -
 Then I give and bequeath unto my be-

 plantation with all the buildings, house
 hold furniture, farming utensils & all my
 live stock consisting of horses, cattle,
 sheep, hogs and poultry for her support
 during her natural life time after which I
 will that their disposal be as here after
 named in this Testament excepting her
 bed & its furniture with her wearing
 apparel. I will that she have the
 disposal of as she may think proper.

Item - I give and bequeath unto my
 Grand son Graner Lickens all Runding
 acres of my land be the same more or
 less including my house and other
 buildings and land off as follows viz
 beginning at a white Oak & Hickory the
 beginning corner of my old tract thence with
 sixty four degrees east one hundred and
 seventy nine paces to a white oak
 thence ^{North} seventy paces to a stake at the
 mouth of the lane - Ten South fifty
 degrees, west eighty paces to a Mulberry.
 Thence with the meadow line North thirty
 four degrees, west sixty paces to a stake
 then South sixty two degrees, west one hun-
 dred and twenty three paces to a stake on
 the original line. Thence with the said
 line to the beginning which said described
 land I promise I bequeath to my ^{Grand} Grand-
 son Graner Lickens by him his heirs
 and assigns to be enjoyed & possessed
 forever after the decease of my beloved
 wife Annah March. I give to my said
 Grand son, Graner Lickens my black
 Negro Slave, my young barrel mare
 with my wagon and all my farming
 utensils together with the increase of
 the same by him to be possessed and
 enjoyed forever after the decease of my
 beloved wife as aforesaid -
 Item - I give and bequeath unto my
 two sons Henry and Graner March
 Junior all the balance of my said
 land to be equally between them in
 such manner as may suit their own
 convenience & by them severally his
 part to be freely and fully possessed
 by them. Their heirs and assigns forever
 after the decease of my said beloved wife

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Hannah Marsh-

I then - I give & bequeath to my son James Marsh the sum of one dollar to be paid to him out of my Estate by my Executors after my decease & the decease of my wife Hannah & by him to be enjoyed forever. I will that seven dollars out of my Estate be equally divided amongst the children of my deceased daughter Hannah likewise after my decease and the decease of my beloved wife of aforesaid.

I then - I give to my Grand daughter Elizabeth Marsh daughter of Granvill Marsh Junr. out of my Estate after the decease of my said wife the sum of three dollars and one good cow by her to be possessed forever after arriving at a suitable age -

I then - I give to my great Grand son Granvill Roberts the sum of two dollars to be paid to him by my Executors out of my Estate when he shall arrive at the age of Twenty one years & by him then to be enjoyed forever.

I then - I will that all the balance of my personal Estate not here in disposed of after the death of my beloved wife or of aforesaid be equally divided & otherwise divided and the proceeds thereof equally divided between my two daughters, namely Ann Hawel & Lydia Anne & by them to be held in possession forever. I likewise make and ordain my son Granvill Marsh Junr. the whole & sole Executor of this my will in trust for the intents and purposes in this my last will and Testament contained and now I the said Granvill Marsh do hereby declare this instrument to be
