 handsaw drawing knife &c, also my leaf table
 at the decease of my wife — also I will to my
 grandson Isaac Corner my Due pot and skillet
 at the decease of my wife and at her decease
 I will to my son John Corner my large bible
Reppone collection of Hymns and confession of Faith —
 Also I will to my grandson William McAmish
 my bushel pot my big oven and crock at
 my wifes decease — Also I will my cupboard
 at my wifes decease to Jane McAmish my
