McWhorter Decd. I also will and bequest unto my son Thamus Lloyd the land where

 all my land adjoining the land of
 him son and that yet bequeathed
 I also will and bequeath to my daughter
 Betsey Hinde one good cow.
 I also will and bequeath unto my
 daughter Peggy Hecker one twenty
 five dollar saddle the two last
 Legacies to be paid in one year
 after my decease. I will that the
 remainder of my moveable property
 be valued by three of my neighbors
 to my son Thomas at trade rates
 he being bound to pay the following
 Legacies at the same rates.
 I will and bequeath unto my daughter
 Polly Hester, Kitty and Sally each
 one horse saddle and bridle with one
 hundred and twenty dollar or soon
 as the becomes of age.
 I will that the land I have ad-
 joining David Hinson, Lemuel Carson
 and others to be sold and the Price of
 it (with the balance of my moveable
 property (if any) to pay my just debts
 and funeral expenses.
 Should there be any remaining after my
 just debts and funeral expenses are
 paid I will that it be equally
 divided amongst all of my children.
 I do also appoint my friend John
 Allison and Saml. Hendry my executors
 to this my last will and to solemnly
 revoking and disavowing all other wills
 Legacies and bequests and do ratify and
 confirm this and no other in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and signed my seal this fourth
