 have given unto my wife Hannah
 Weemes (that is to say) if she is married
 to another man then it is to be his
 and if she doth not marry it is his
 property after her Death and not before
 Item, I give and bequeath unto that child
 which my beloved wife Hannah is now
 pregnant with if it be a son the
 remainder of my land be the same
 more or less, but if that child yet unborn
 be a Daughter the last mentioned Land is
 to be valued and she is to have the
 Land at the valuation as tho it was
 personal Estate Item, my Negro girl Clara
 is to remain and be the property of my wife
 while she remains my widow and afterwards
 she is to be the property of my son James
 but if the said Clara shall have any children
 they are to be equally divided amongst all my
 heirs After all my personal Estate is to
 be sold and equally divided between my wife
 and children and the money to be put to
 Interest untill the children come of age
 all the Land except the home place is
 to be rented and the profits arising
 therefrom is for the support of the
 family, my son John if he marries he
 is to have his Land in possession
 I further will that my beloved wife Hannah
 Weemes and my Brother George Weemes act
 as my true and Lawful Executors to see
 that this my last will and testament may
 be fully complied with in witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
 seal this 24th day of May in the year
 1819
