First - I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of allmighty God who gave it, I my body I commit to the dust, to be buried at the direction of my friends.

I also order that all my just debts and funeral expense be punctually paid out of my estate.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth her choice of one out of four of my horses, the other two to be disposed of as hereinafter named, her saddle, her bed and furniture, one cow and calf chosen by her out of my stock, with all the household and kitchen furniture, excepting such articles as may herein be disposed of together with my loom and

tackling to be disposed of by her as she may think proper.

I will that my son James may have one hundred acres of my land on the side of the tract on which we now live, from end to end of the tract, by himself, his heirs and assigns to enjoy it forever.

I give and bequeath to my son George one hundred acres of my land adjoining my son James to be laid off from end to end of the tract as aforesaid, also one of my horses named Buck, his saddle and bridle, one cow and calf, one bed and furniture, six sheep, one ox and one mattock, all and each of these by him his heirs and assigns to be enjoyed and possessed forever.

I give to my son Wilson Allen one horse a young sabel, one saddle and bridle, and one bed and furniture, also that he be kept at the barn in which he is now engaged, until he is ^{gone} through it, the expense to be paid out of my estate by my executor, and that he receive thirty dollars in cash out of my estate at the end of his said schooling, all of which by him his heirs and assigns to be enjoyed and possessed forever.

I give to my youngest son Samuel all the balance of my land & all and singular my farming utensils, the remainder of my cattle & horses, hogs, & the remainder of the sheep, one bed and furniture all of which by him, his heirs and assigns to be possessed and enjoyed forever after his arrival at the age of twenty one years.

I will that my wagon so soon as it is fixed up, be owned and possessed equally by my three sons, James George & Samuel.

I give and bequeath to my two daughters Katharine & Mary Ann each the sum of five dollars to be enjoyed forever.

I will that my house & other buildings be

for the use of my beloved wife during her natural lifetime, and that the profits arising from my plantation by culture be applied to the use of my said wife & my son Samuel, & to the support of their stock.

I will that my granddaughter Elizabeth Dixon Bell have one horse, saddle & bridle at her coming to the age of eighteen years, to be furnished out of the legacies by me now willed to my wife & my son Samuel by her to be enjoyed forever.

I hereby constitute ordain and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth, & my son James Bell the sole executrix & executor of this my last will and testament, without their giving any security for their performance.

And I do hereby ratify and confirm this as my last will and testament, in the presence of Thomas Doan & Alexander Henderson in due form of law, as witness my hand & seal this thirtieth day of May 1816.
