 as the other girls has had a bed and
 a cow. Thirdly and after my wife's death
 or at the end of her widow hood the
 plantation and all that I have
 owned to have shall be sold at
 publick sale by my Executors and
 the money divided in equal shares
 amongst all my children only that
 the first that takes to my daughter
 Elizabeth. The Executors shall not give
 it to Peter Roden But they shall
 buy a piece of land and let the
 said Roden settle on it as long
 as he lives and then my Executors
 shall make over the same to their
 children. Fourthly my Plantation that
 my two sons live on namely
 George and John is to be divided
 into two parts between them and
 it is to be divided as follows
 beginning at the mouth of the spring
 branch thence up said Branch till
 against the upper end of John's corn
 thence a straight course to the live
 nest to Hatchasons only the saw mill
 and land that lies on the north
 side of the creek excepted and if they
 take the aforesaid land George Freebairn
 shall pay one hundred and eighty dollars
 to my Executors to be paid in three
 payments the first payment in eight
 months after my death and the next
 in six months after that and the
 third payment in six months after
 that and the payments shall be in
 equal divisions and John Freebairn
 shall pay to my Executors the sum
