Nothing doubting, but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner, first I give and bequeath unto Jacob Mismar a waggon and the gear belonging to the same and two horses and all my mine and cabinet tools and also my bonds amounting to one hundred and fifty two pounds, ten shillings due in Pennsylvania and several bonds worth the sum of forty dollars reserved out of said bonds if in case the said John Harmon wants them and lastly I do appoint Jacob Mismar my sole Executor to fulfil as my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of December, 1798,
