desirous to dispose of all such worldly  
substances as it hath pleased God to  
bless me with do make my last  
will and Testament in manner  
and form following (Viz) principally  
and first of all I recommend my  
Soul into the hands of Almighty God  
who gave it and my body to the earth  
to be buried in decent Christian  
burial at the discretion of Executors  
hereafter named.

First it is my will that all my  
just debts be paid out of my per-  
ishable property -

2<sup>d</sup> It is my will that my lands  
and perishable property remain in  
the hands of the law wife Margaret  
and my three daughters (Viz) Rebecca

Charity and Vina for five years unless the my lands can be sold for sixteen hundred dollars in money. But it may be sold sooner. The majority of the Legatee require it also it is my will that my daughter Margaret (deceast) shall remain in the hands of my Executors and to be put to the use of my daughter Charity as she may stand in need.

3<sup>rd</sup> It is my will that all my perishable property after my just debts are paid to be equally divided between beloved wife and my three daughters. Rebecca, Charity and Vina and also my two good manses, Ed. Pace and Jan remain remains on the plantation and be for the mutual use of my beloved wife and my daughters Rebecca, Charity and Vina as long as the live together and if the should separate then the said manse to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my wife Margaret and my three daughters above named.

4<sup>th</sup> It is my will that my son Robert have the care and use of my plantation for the use of himself and my beloved wife and my daughters, Rebecca, Charity and Vina until the lands be sold and to have all the over plus after what is sufficient for the use of the family named in this item for his own use and profit that he receive by his labor.

5<sup>th</sup> It is my will that when my lands are sold that my son Robert have one hundred dollars more than

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His equal share and Washington and George my sons to have fifty dollars each more than their equal share 6<sup>th</sup> It is my will that the balance of the money arising from the sale of my lands to be equally divided between my beloved wife Margaret and all my children hereafter named (viz) Elizabeth McKean, William Lauderdale, Jane Sharp, Mary Freeman, Anne Warner, Darcy Hall, John Lauderdale, Ann Girdner, James Lauderdale, Samuel Lauderdale, Margaret died, Rebecca, Charity and Vina Lauderdale Robert Washington and George Lauderdale

7<sup>th</sup> It is my will that Mary Freeman share of my Estate to remain in the hands of my Executors to be under her the said Mary Freeman's directions and to other during her life and if they may be any remaining after her decease to be for the use of her children.

8<sup>th</sup> And lastly I constitute and appoint William McBride Esq. and John M. Kiegar Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others or former wills or testaments they may have to fore made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth day of June, 1822.
