publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following that is to
say first I give and bequath my Soul to God
who gave it and secondly my body to be
buried in some pleasant Christian Burial
ground at the Discretion of my Executor
who will be hereafter named and thirdly
what worldly estate it has pleased God to
Bless me with in this life I give and
bequath in Manner and form as follow
1st of all I give and bequath unto my
loving wife Sarah Woolsey fifteen acres of
land on the south East side of the tract of
land whereon I now live
only I give and bequath unto my wife Sarah
Woolsey all and singular my Household
furniture and kitchen furniture and farming
tools as long as she continues on the
place and further I give and bequath
unto my loving wife Sarah Woolsey thirty
Dollars in silver to remain in the hands
of my Executors until such time or
times as Distress and need may
requier it
3d And thirdly I give and bequath unto
my eldest son John Woolsey one Dollar
and my Reasons whi I dont give him
more is that I have gave to him
heretofore
fourthly I give and bequath unto my
loving wife Sarah Woolsey my Box pair
Linen addel and Bridal and Lin.

choice of my stock of cattle as far as two cows and their young calves if they have any at the time of her deceasing of them & further I give unto her all the hogs that I have

5th fifthly I give and bequeath unto my loving son Thomas Woolsey one Dollar and my reasons is that the great distress we are at out he cold not git it

6th sixthly I give and bequeath unto my Daughter and surviving law Mary English and Andrew English her Husband one Dollar and no more.

7th seventhly I give ad bequeath unto the Heirs of William Osburn and Sarah Osburn one Dollar

8th eighthly I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Woolsey fifty Acres of land adjoining Andrew Dinkins tract of land taken in one inker body as running with the corces of the survey wherein the fifty acres lays

9th ninthly I give and bequeath unto Jeaphaniah Woolsey fifty Acres of land lying at the lower end of the tract whereon Turner Smith lived on the main Lick creek the same to be taken agreeable to the courses and distane of the old survey

10th tenthly I give and bequeath unto Deacal Woolsey the upper fifty acres in the aforesaid tract including the buildings wherein Turner Smith lived that is to say on the main Lick creek

11th eleventhly I give and bequeath to Jellian Woolsey fifty Acres of land adjoining Simon Pipers lands and lying on a creek noan by the name of Giburns Creek adjoining the former tract that was bequeathed to Jeaphaniah and Sarah

12th twelfthly I give and bequeath unto Clappier Woolsey sixty acres of land including the

manshing house and Barn and orchard and adjoining
the fifteen acres that was bequeathed to my wife
Sarah Woolsey and to Gun with the former lines from
East to West

13th and what Balance of land there remains after
taking out the several parts heretofore
bequeathed of one of my home plantacian I will
and bequeath to Samuel Woolsey Beaphaniah
Woolsey Sarah Woolsey Clapher Woolsey Jethias
Woolsey to be equally Devided between them five.
14th fourteenth I will and bequeath unto my
son Samuel Woolsey one hundred and fifty
Dollars

15th fifteenth I will and bequeath unto
Beaphaniah Woolsey one hundred and fifty
Dollars

16th sixteenth I will and bequeath
unto Sarah Woolsey one hundred and
fifty Dollars

17th seventeenth I will and bequeath unto
Clapher Woolsey one hundred and fifty
Dollars

18th eighteen I will and bequeath unto
Jethias Woolsey one hundred and fifty
Dollars


19th nineteenth I do hereby will and



In the Name of God Amen
I Zephaniah Woolsey Gentleman of the
State of Tennessee and County of Green
Being sick and weak in body but of
sound mind and memory calling to mind
the mortality of all flesh that it appoint-
ed for all to die - Doth make and
Ordain this my last will and
Testament Disallowing all wills or
testaments before this time made but
confirm all legacies by me bequeathed
before this time - First I recommend
my soul to God that gave it and my
body to the dust to be buried in
a Christian like and decent manner
nothing Doubting but God will restore
it at the Resurrection of the just And
as to those worldly Goods wherewith God
hath blessed me I give and bequeath
in the following manner that is
to say first all just Debts and funeral
charges be paid and satisfied then
